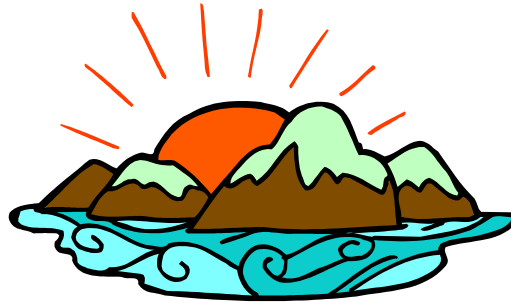

# Goal

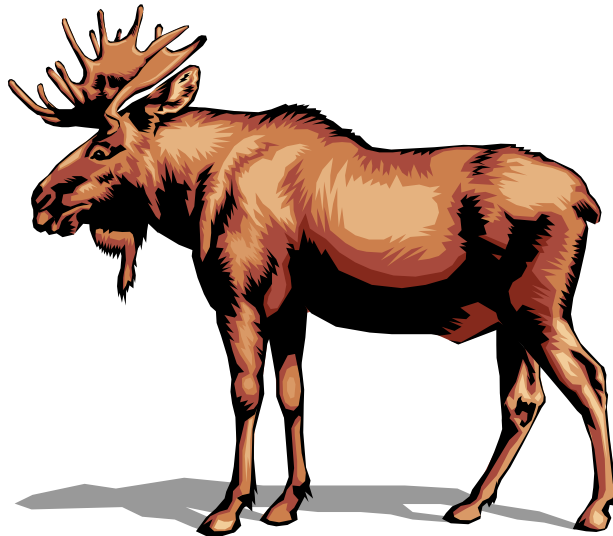
## Right-size King Salmon by 2023

- *Reduce footprint from 53 bldgs to 11*
- Improve site security
- Reduce utility/maintenance costs
- Meet/exceed 11 AF divert requirements
- Invest around *\$50 million by 2023*
  - \$13 million to repair Hangar (Bldg 160)
    - Roof, Systems, and Doors
  - \$20 million for airfield repairs
    - Ramp, Taxiways, Grounding, Lighting
  - \$2 million for dorm repairs (Bldg 601)
    - Roof, Systems, and Other repairs
  - \$15 million for various projects
    - Fire detection/alarms, Utilities, Aircraft operations support bldgs
- Transfer no longer needed tenant buildings to current tenants or Bureau of Land Management
